

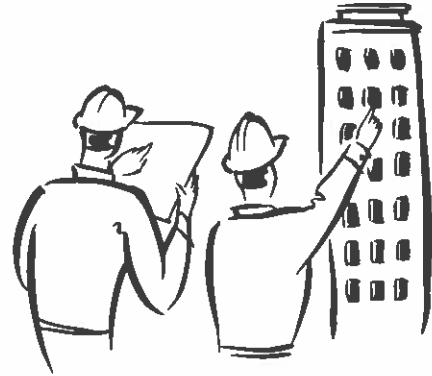
Understanding Income

COMPARING TYPICAL INCOMES

Minimum wage is the lowest hourly pay allowed by law. Salaries start at minimum wage and go up.
