SAFETY AND RESPONSIBILITIES IN THE WORKPLACE

A) Safety

Safety is defined as freedom from danger, injury or damage, or the state of being protected against harm.

B) Employers' Responsibilities

Employers must:

- ensure that the workplace is healthy and safe
- make workers aware of workplace hazards
- remove and/or control hazards
- monitor levels and keep records of worker exposure to hazardous substances (e.g. noise, chemicals) in the workplace
- determine the personal protective equipment (PPE) to be worn (e.g. ear plugs, safety goggles, hard hats)
- establish safe working procedures; provide instruction and supervision
- ensure that all measures/procedures prescribed by the Act respecting occupational health and safety (R.S.Q.C.S-2.1) are carried out
- take every reasonable precaution to protect workers

Supervisor Responsibilities

Supervisors must:

- tell workers about all hazards
- ensure that workers wear personal protective equipment
- instruct workers to follow safe working procedures
- take every reasonable precaution to protect workers

Worker Responsibilities

Workers must:

- wear the personal protective equipment required by the employer
- follow safe working procedures
- report all hazards to the supervisor or employer
- not engage in horseplay
- report all injuries or illnesses occurring at work to the employer
